Course Goals and Objectives – Why You Should Attend

The objective of the Advanced Marina Management (AMM) course is to "Help the Best to Become Better." Students will learn about policies and practices that have been successful in other regions of the world, leading to new solutions to management problems. Above all, the intensive participatory nature of these residency courses will establish a long lasting network of contacts in the industry, a major benefit for years to come. Graduates of these courses return to their ports and marinas with a renewed energy and fresh approach to management.

^{*}Please note the class is limited to 18 people. No more than two people may attend from the same marina.

Payment Schedule: (a minimum number of students is required to run each course)

- Once we receive your complete application package, we will send you a confirmation email, at which time a \$1,000 deposit is due*
- Full payment is due no later than January 15, 2024

Residency at the venue, for five nights, is mandatory. Extended reservations are a personal expense and can be made by contacting the hotel directly by providing a personal credit card for payment.

* Do not make travel arrangements until you receive email confirmation that you are accepted into the course

Method of Payment:

- All deposits and further payments must be made payable to and sent directly to AMI
- Payments may be made by check or credit card AMI accepts only VISA or MasterCard
- Make checks payable in US dollars, drawn on a U.S. Bank, to the Association of Marina Industries

Cancellation and Refund Polices:
